

BofA names 5 "student leaders" for internship program

[Bank of America](#) on Tuesday announced the names of five teenagers from Massachusetts who have been selected for a summer program the bank runs focused on community service.

The Student Leaders Program, as it is known, is an eight-week, paid summer internship that places the teens working in local nonprofits such as Associated Grant Makers, Artists for Humanity, [Whittier Street Health Center](#), Year Up, and the [Boys & Girls Clubs of Boston](#). They also will attend a student leadership summit in Washington, D.C. during July, which includes attending policy briefings on Capitol Hill and leadership training.

Bank of America said in a press release that it is investing more than \$1 million in the student leadership program and has committed more than \$8 million since the program began in 2004.
