

## Brookline residents elected to Boys & Girls Clubs' board

Brookline — Brookline residents **Juliette Galicia Pico** and **Gill Fishman** were elected to Boys & Girls Clubs of Boston's Board of Overseers during the 115th annual meeting hosted Nov. 16, at the Westin Copley Place.



Pico is one of 17 new overseers joining a group of 120 philanthropists, business leaders and volunteers who serve as ambassadors to the agency. Pico is a principal at Lourie & Cutler P.C., where she focuses on taxation and estate and business planning. She has extensive experience in corporate, limited liability company and partnership matters, including business entity formation, acquisitions and sales of businesses. She advises clients in charitable giving, and nonprofit entities on a variety of tax issues. In addition, Pico represents individuals and businesses in all phases of tax disputes with the Internal Revenue Service, the Massachusetts Department of Revenue, the U.S. Tax Court and before the Massachusetts Appellate Tax Board. Pico received a bachelor's degree in accounting from Boston College and a law degree from Boston College Law School. She is fluent in Spanish.

Fishman's firm has provided graphic design and branding services for Boys & Girls Clubs of Boston, donating a significant portion of his agency's fees. Fishman graduated with honors from Harvard College with a degree in economics, and received a master's degree in architecture from the Harvard Graduate School of

Design. He also studied at the Harvard School of Education, and at MIT in photography with Minor White.
